# **EVENT SAFETY PLAN**

## 1.) Equipment list for pit exit & start / finish:

2 x Dry Chemical "ABC" Fire Extinguisher, 1-20lb. Two-way radio (walkie-talkie) for talking to race control Flags for communicating with drivers (start/finish only)

# 2.) Medical Doctor / Medical Staff / Ambulance plans:

No Medical Doctor is scheduled to be in attendance at these events. In the event of emergency medical situation 911 will be used.

### 3.) Emergency Services Vehicle:

One of the "tow vehicles" will be outfitted with a limited range of tools for use by on-site personnel; these include crowbars, hacksaws, bolt cutters, wrenches and a hydraulic floor jack. If the wreck is considered to potentially exceed our capabilities the closest Fire Department will be called to assist.

## 4.) Mobile Fire Fighting Equipment:

Fire Response:

One of the "tow vehicles" will be outfitted with some of the 10 and 20 lb. Dry Chemical Extinguishers to act as back-up and second response to the Marshal Station's first response to a fire. - if the fire is considered to potentially exceed our capabilities to control, the nearest Fire Department will be called to assist.

### 5.) Driver Rescue/Extraction Equipment:

Extrication in a severe incident where a driver is trapped:

A limited range of tools are available for use by on site personnel, these include crowbars, hacksaws, bolt cutters, wrenches and a hydraulic floor jack. - if the wreck is considered to potentially exceed our capabilities the closest Fire Department will be called to assist. Please see the Appendixes at the end of this document for local contacts.

### 6.) Personal Injury including Spectators:

In the event of a serious accident an ambulance will be called to assist the driver. All other officials, participants and spectators will be dealt with in a similar fashion.

### 7.) Hospitals, Fire Departments and RCMP:

Please see the Appendixes at the end of this document for details on each of the venues, Transfers to larger specialized hospitals may be required depending on the nature of the injuries. Possible hospitals are as follows:
